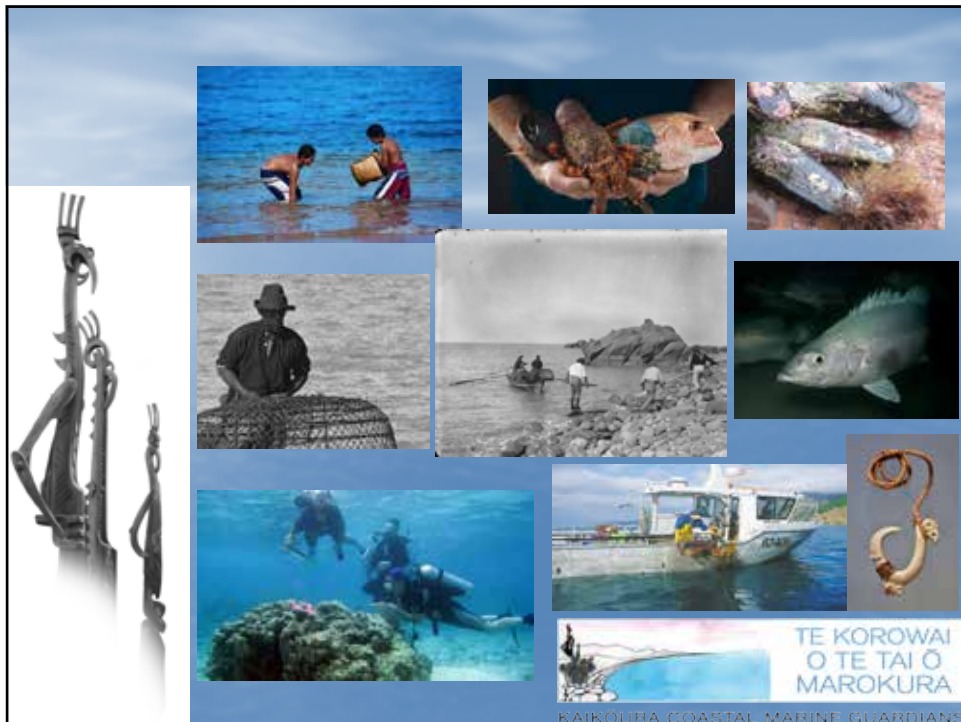


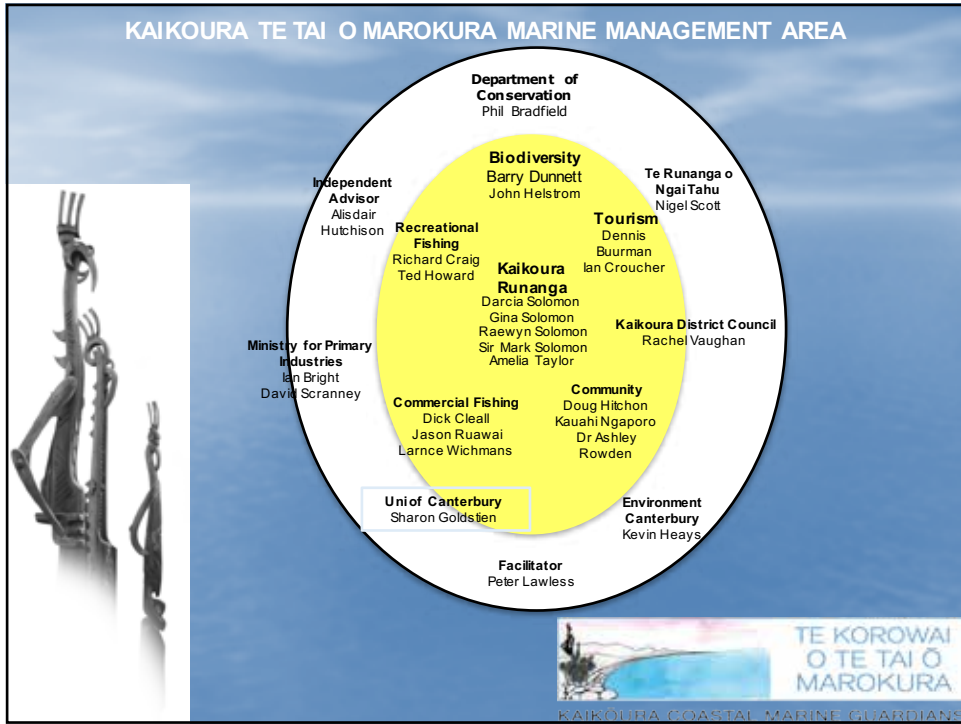

What is 'telson clipping'?

The telson is the central part of the tail fan on a rock lobster. Telson clipping is a way of marking spiny rock lobster to make it clear that they have been responsibly caught. One-third of the telson is cut off so that it is noticeably shorter than the other sections of the tail fan. (See the picture below).



Once a fisher has checked that a lobster is legal size, condition and not subject to any other restrictions it is carrying eggs they must immediately cut one-third off the central telson.

A person must not possess any spiny rock lobster taken from within the Kaitiaki Marine Area if it has not had one-third of the central telson cut off.
